Program Overview

Michigan Training Connect Overview for Individuals

Michigan Training Connect (MiTC) is a centralized location for job seekers to explore training options available through the state's federally mandated Eligible Training Provider List (ETPL). MiTC lists training programs for individuals qualifying for an Individual Training Account (ITA) under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), which provides participants with workforce investment activities that increase employment, retention, earnings and occupational skill attainment which improves the quality of the workforce, reduces welfare dependency, and enhances the productivity and competitiveness of the economy.

MiTC serves as a virtual marketplace connecting individuals to education and training providers offering in-demand training opportunities. Under WIOA a training program is defined as one or more courses or classes, or a structured curriculum that leads to: a recognized post-secondary credential, or its equivalent, employment.

Job Seekers can use MiTC to explore career options, set educational goals, and find the training they need to achieve their goals. On the MiTC website, job seekers choose between different methods of finding the providers and programs that meet their specific needs.

Michigan Training Connect Overview for Providers

Any post-secondary school legally operating in Michigan may apply to have their education and training program(s) listed on MiTC. MiTC includes education and training programs offered through public and private community colleges, proprietary schools, non-profits, joint labor management organizations, and corporate training centers. Training providers must have all applicable licenses and be able to supply program performance data.

Training providers can add a new program at any time to be posted on the MiTC website. To apply for placement on the MiTC website, a training provider must complete the MiTC Application Form for Training Institutions found on the MiTC home page. The training program must have appropriate licensure and meet minimum performance data standards. If the program is approved, it will then appear for public viewing under "Training Search" on Michigan Training Connect. Training institutions on MiTC agree to report required performance outcome information on an annual basis to qualify for continued eligibility for placement on MiTC.
