Michigan Training Connect (MiTC) is a centralized location for students to explore training options available through the state's federally mandated Eligible Training Provider List. MiTC compiles training programs for individuals qualifying for an Individual Training Account under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA).

What exactly does MiTC do?

MiTC provides students, parents and guidance counselors with accurate and useful information about education and training programs available throughout the state. Through MiTC, WIOA offers participants workforce investment activities that increase employment, retention, earnings and occupational skill attainment – and this improves the quality of the workforce, reduces welfare dependency, and enhances the productivity and competitiveness of the economy.

What kind of organizations participate in MiTC?

MiTC includes education and training programs offered through public and private community colleges, proprietary schools, non-profits, unions, corporate training centers, adult education programs and intermediate school district career centers.

What are the eligibility requirements?

Any type of school legally operating in Michigan may apply to have education and training program(s) listed on MiTC. A training program is one or more courses that leads to a recognized postsecondary credential, employment or measurable skill gains toward a credential or employment.

What is the application process for training providers?

To apply for placement on the MiTC website, a training provider must complete the MiTC application form for training institutions found on the MiTC home page and email the completed form.

Training providers can add or update a program at any time to be posted on the MiTC website. To apply for placement on the MiTC website, training providers are invited to apply using the automated account process on www.mitalent.org by clicking CREATE ACCOUNT, then TRAINING PROVIDER, and completing the application. Training providers must have appropriate licensure and programs must meet minimum performance data standards. If the program is approved by the local Michigan Works! Agency, it will then appear for public viewing under "Training Search" on Michigan Training Connect. Training providers must agree to report required performance outcome information on an annual basis to qualify for continued eligibility for placement on MiTC.

How do Michiganders benefit from MiTC?

MiTC assists students with making knowledgeable decisions about their professional future and career. Students use MiTC to:

- Explore career options
- Set educational goals
- Find training

Parents use MiTC to help their children select appropriate education and training programs with a proven track record.

Guidance counselors use MiTC to engage students in career exploration and as an aid in the development of a career plan.

In addition to providing information for the public, MiTC serves as a virtual marketplace connecting individuals to education and training providers offering in-demand training opportunities.
